Competition Entry Fee:	Entry fee for Swedish Judo Open is 60 Euro per person including lunch during the competition
Special Offer:	No entry fee and free accommodation during the competition for current European-, Asian-, World- and Olympic champions.

Award Money:	There is 1 000 € award money for the Winner of each category. The minimum number of participants per weight category should be 8 competitors. If there is less, the award is 500 €. Minimum 4 competitors.
EJU Training Camp:	From Monday 1/11 to Thursday 4/11 will there be an EJU training camp. All prices include accommodation at Hotel Plaza and full board and camp fee from Monday 1/11 until lunch Thursday 4/11. Single room 428 € per person for the whole camp. Double room 343 € per person for the whole camp. Triple room 283 € per person for the whole camp. Four bed room 233 € per person for the whole camp. Camp only 50 €
EJU Camp Fee:	Through EJU regulation the organizer has to take out an extra camp fee for every participant with 100 €. For EJU athletes 30 €.
Liability:	Neither the organizer of the event, nor Borås Judo Club or the Swedish Judo Federation (not any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to your property arising out of your participation and travelling in connection with the Swedish Judo Open 2010.
Insurance:	Every competitor must have an international insurance for injuries.

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§ judogi

The contestants must wear judogis that meet the following conditions:
Made of strong cotton fabric or similar material (see guideline), in good condition (without tears). The material must not be so thick, hard or slippery as to prevent the opponent from getting a grip. Colours: blue for the first contestant and white or off-white for the second contestant.

Mandatory markings:

Back identification of athletes must include name and country:

1. Each competitor taking part in the EJU events is obliged to have sewn on the back of his Judogi an appropriate back number consisting of two parts: Fixed upper part with surname and National Olympic Abbreviation.
Customisable lower part reserved for sponsors and/or EJU event logo, unique for each event.
2. The standardised back numbers and bibs of athletes are described in annex:

3. The purchasing procedure for the EJU Back Number is described in the annex:
Ordering Procedure of EJU Back Numbers
4. Only the original EJU Back Numbers carrying the EJU logo and acquired exclusively according to procedure in Article 3 will be accepted at the judogi check.
5. The EJU Back Numbers are mandatory for all European Championships, World Cups in the territory of EJU, European Cups, and other events specified by EJU. It is valid for all categories (Senior, U23, U20, U17, Veteran).



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Acceptable markings

1. National Emblem (on left breast of jacket).
Maximum size 100 cm².




2. Shoulder markings (from collar - across shoulder down sleeve - both sides of jacket). Maximum length 25 cm and maximum width 5 cm in national colours or manufacturer's logo of official supplier. (The same advertising or national colours can be on both sides)



3. Manufacturer's logo (on bottom front of jacket, on bottom front of left leg of the trousers and on end of the belt.) Maximum size 20 cm². EJU official Suppliers are allowed to place the "EJU approved" Logo above their logo (adjacent) on bottom front of jacket. It is permitted to place the manufacturer's logo on one of the sleeves but inside the 25 cm x 5 cm area instead of at the bottom front of the jacket (max 20 cm²)



4. Advertising on the sleeves, 10 cm x 10 cm on each sleeve (different advertising allowed). These areas must be fixed just below and in contact with the shoulder markings of 25 cm x 5 cm.



5. Indication of the placing (1st, 2nd, 3rd) at Olympic Games or World Championships, in an area of 6 cm x 10 cm at the bottom front left side of the jacket.



6. The name of the contestant may be printed or stitched on the belt, lower front of the jacket and upper front of the trousers up to a maximum of 3 cm x 10 cm.
