1. Technical Information

1.1. DATE

The competition will be held in **Prague, Czech Republic**, the **22nd and 23rd October 2011**.

Saturday 22nd October: European Kata Championship

Sunday 23rd October: European Open Kata Championship

1.2. AGE & GRADE

Competitors are to be 18 years of age on the 1st January 2011 and a minimum of 1st Dan.

Couples may be formed of either 2 males, 2 females, or a male and a female.

1.3. KATA

Each Kata will be divided in two groups according to the Age of Tori (see 2.1 Competition formula): the title of European Champion for that group of age will be awarded. The European Open Kata Championship is the Competition among the best three pairs classified in each group: the title of absolute European champion for each Kata will be awarded.

The Kata recognised for the championships, will be five:

- Nage-no-kata;
- Katame-no-Kata;
- Ju-no-Kata;
- Kime-no-kata
- Kodokan-Goshin-jutsu;

The IJF Kata "Criteria for Kata Evaluation" will be used to judge the Kata with reference also to the official Kodokan edition of video.

1.4. PARTICIPATION

Each federation may enter up to a maximum of 2 couples per each group of Kata, totalling up to a maximum of 4 couples per Kata. The competitors can only participate in one Kata.

The competitors must be of the same nationality as the country which enters them. Competitors who have double nationality can only represent 1 participating country.

When a competitor changes nationality, he/she must wait 3 years before he can represent the new country, unless the two countries concerned (the old country and the new country) agree to authorize his entry for the new nationality and this is accepted by the IJF (According to the Olympic charter Art. 42)

1.5. REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION MUST BE MADE BY THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AFFILIATED TO THE EUROPEAN JUDO UNION IN JUMAS. REGISTRATION NOT FROM THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AND NOT IN THE JUMAS SYSTEM WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Numerical registration

The numerical registration must arrive at the EJU secretariat and the organisers not later than 2 months before. (See Annex 2 for the deadline and the address of the EJU Secretariat can be found in Annex 4. Please use Form 1 for the numerical inscription).

Nominal inscriptions

The nominal inscriptions must be entered in JUMAS. The JUMAS entry closes Monday of the week before. (See Annex 2 for deadline. Form 2 must be sent to the organisers only for information purpose). See Annex 2 for the deadlines).

Entry fee

The federations must pay an entry fee per competitor until the deadline listed in Annex 2.

The inscription fee is 100 Euro per participating competitor, to be paid to:

All payments entered after the inscriptions deadline will be 125 Euro per competitor.

Once the inscription fee is paid it will not be refundable if the competitors fail to participate in the competition, however, if the athletes produce a medical certificate, the surplus paid entry fee will be kept on credit for the following event on behalf of the concerned federation.

1.6. CONTROL OF NATIONS

a. Finances

The federations must be in order with the annual fee and other financial obligations to the EJU. The entry fee per competitor must be paid to the EJU. In order to take part at the competition the national federation must have fulfilled the necessary payments to the organizer and the EJU.

b. Control of Entries

Identity: Nationality and age of the participants. (Each athlete's passport has to be presented to the EJU official by the representative of the delegation.)

List of entries: The list of entries is confirmed with the EJU official.

No changes will be accepted after the end of the nation control.

c. Accreditation

A list of all the registered athletes is generated by the JUMAS system, which is confirmed by the head of delegation that it is the final list. (The competitors must only be present at the nation control if they have to make a new Jumas card).

The EJU accreditation cards, which are printed from JUMAS, must be presented before each demonstration.

1.7. CLOTHING

Uniform

- Strongly made in cotton or similar material, in good condition (without rent or tear).
- The competitions will be held in white judogi.
- The jacket shall be long enough to cover the thighs and shall at a minimum reach to the fists when the arms are fully extended downwards at the sides of the body. The body of the jacket shall be worn with the left side crossed over the right and shall be wide enough to have a minimum overlap of 20 cm at the level of the bottom of the rib-cage.
- The sleeves of the jacket must reach to the wrist joint at the maximum and 5 cm above the wrist joint at the minimum. A space of 10-15 cm shall exist between the sleeve and the arm, along the entire length of the sleeve.
- The trousers shall be long enough to cover the legs and shall at the maximum reach the ankle joint and at the minimum 5 cm. above the ankle joint. A space of 10-15 cm. shall exist between the trouser leg and the leg along the entire length of the trouser leg.
- The belt is black, 4 to 5 cm wide and long enough to go twice around the waist and leave 20 to 30 cm protruding from each side of the knot when tied.
- Female competitors shall wear under the jacket a plain white T-shirt, with short sleeves, rather strong, long enough to be worn inside the trousers.
- EJU Kata Championship back number must be applied on the back of the jacket: no old back numbers are allowed.
- Zori or mules are part of the uniform.

Acceptable markings

- National emblem on left breast of jacket maximum size 100 cm²
- Manufacturer's trade mark on bottom-front of the jacket, on bottom front of the left leg of the trousers and on the belt. Maximum size 20 cm²
- Shoulder markings from collar, across shoulder down the arm on both sides of the jacket with the same advertising or national colours on both sides. Maximum length = 25 cm – Maximum width 5 cm.

Hygiene

- The Judogi shall be clean, dry and without unpleasant odour.
- The nails of the feet and hands shall be cut short.
- The personal hygiene of the athletes shall be of a high standard
- Long hair has to be bound with an elastic band.
- Spectacles, jewellery pieces are prohibited.
- Make up is not allowed.
- The Back Numbers will have to be sewn already on the Judogi.

1.8. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FEDERATIONS

a. Medical certificate

The gender certificate and the medical certificate of the participants are not required.

The participants will compete under the full responsibility of the Federations.

b. Insurance

Each National Federation is responsible for insuring its competitors against « injury and third part risk (public liability) » during the period of the championships.

The European Judo Union declines all responsibility.

c. Attitude of the competitors

The member-Federations are responsible for the behaviour and attitude of their competitors at the championships.

1.9. ANTI-DOPING

No anti-doping tests are done at the Kata European Championships.

1.10. FREE ACCREDITATION PER DELEGATION

Each Delegation will be given a number of free accreditations depending on the number of Kata couples.

2. Judges

2.1. COMPETITION FORMULA

EUROPEAN KATA CHAMPIONSHIP

Each Kata will be divided in two groups according to the age of Tori as follow:

Nage no Kata	Cat 1	from the age of 18 (1993) until the age of 35 (1976)
	Cat 2	from the age of 36 (1975) and over
Katame no Kata	Cat 1	from the age of 18 (1993) until the age of 45 (1966)
	Cat 2	from the age of 46 (1965) and over
Ju no Kata	Cat 1	from the age of 18 (1993) until the age of 45 (1966)
	Cat 2	from the age of 46 (1965) and over
Kime no Kata	Cat 1	from the age of 18 (1993) until the age of 47 (1964)
	Cat 2	from the age of 48 (1963) and over
Kodokan Goshinjutsu	Cat 1	from the age of 18 (1993) until the age of 47 (1964)
	Cat 2	from the age of 48 (1963) and over

The Age of Uke has no restrictions.

For each age group the pair with most point will be awarded the gold medal, the pair with the second most point will be awarded the silver medal and the third, the bronze medal.

The Competition will be held on four mats.

OPEN EUROPEAN KATA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Top three pairs for each group of age (6 pairs for each Kata) will compete in the Open European Kata Championship.

For each Kata the pair with most point will be awarded the gold medal, the pair with the second most point will be awarded the silver medal and the third, the bronze medal.

The Competition will be on three mats.

2.2. POINT SYSTEM

The Judges are five and will award points on the official EJU scoring sheet. The total score of three Judges will be totaled to produce the final score: the maximum score and the minimum score will be cancelled.

Each technique and open and closing ceremonies are evaluated with a maximum positive score of 10 points. The positive score is decreased by mistakes. The evaluation of every technique of Kata has to consider the principle and the opportunity of execution: the evaluation (included the open and close ceremony) has to be comprehensive.

Definition of mistakes:

- **Forgotten technique** – score is Zero and the total score of the Kata is halved. If the forgotten technique is more than one, zero score will be given to the technique but the total score will be not halved again. If the halved total value is not a whole number, the score will be rounded up.
- **Big mistake:** when the execution of the principle is incorrect (5 points are deducted and the maximum number of crosses is 1)
- **Medium Mistake:** when one or more elements of the principle are not applied in the correct way (3 points are deducted and the maximum number of crosses is 1).
- **Small mistake:** imperfection in the application of the technique (1 point is deducted and the maximum number of crosses is 2).

For every technique without a big mistake, the minimum score has to be 5. The evaluation of fluidity, course and rhythm represents the global vision of the whole Kata (included the rei): • If there is no big mistake in the Kata, the minimum result will be 5 and the maximum 10.

- If there is a big mistake in the Kata (including the rei), the score must not be more than 5.
- In case of a forgotten technique, the score or fluidity, course and rhythm is zero.

In the Nage no Kata, right and left techniques will be evaluated globally (only one score).

In case of equal score between pairs, the following criteria will be applied:

- Total value of big mistakes - wins who makes less mistakes;
- If still equal, total value of medium mistakes will be considered. - wins the pair who makes less mistakes;
- If still equal, total value of small mistakes will be considered - wins the pair who makes less mistakes;
- If still equal, the score of fluidity will decide. Wins the pair who has a better score.

If two pairs are both placing 3rd place after the above mentioned criteria, the kata will be repeated in order to assign the medal.

2.3. SYSTEM OF JUDGING

Each Kata shall be evaluated by five judges under the supervision of the EJU Kata Commission.
The five judges will be positioned on the Shomen side and they will seat at about 1 m. distance apart from.

The rule of neutrality will be applied: cannot be judged a pair of the same Nation.

The position of the five judges will be the same for all the competition.

A Judge cannot be a competitor.

The judges shall always be in their position before the arrival of the couple in the competition area.
The judge in the centre stands up and, with tense arms and palms of the hands turned upward, invites the couple to enter the competition area.

The couple enters and leaves the competition area at the opposite side of shomen: the Start and end of Kata (opening and closing ceremony) is at 10 m distance (bow to the mat).

Any behavior of Tori or Uke inside the Competition area that is contrary to the spirit of Kata will reduce the score of the ceremony.

2.4. DRAW

The draw to establish the sort of each group will be done the day before the competition: the pairs medalist of the European Championship 2010 will be considered head of series: the pair that is head of series will be the last pair of the group that shows the Kata.

Official dress (jacket and tie) is required in the draw room.


The draw for the sort of the Open Kata Championship will be done in the Sport Hall after the European Kata Championship.

2.5. COMPETITION AREA

The Competition area has dimensions 10 x 10 metres and shall be covered by Tatamis or similar acceptable material.

The Competition area must be fixed to a resilient floor. When more adjoining competition areas are used, a common safety area of 2 metres is necessary.

A strip of visible colour adhesive tape, approximately 10 cm. wide and 50 cm. long, shall be fixed on the centre of the competition area 6 m. apart, to indicate the starting position of Tori and Uke. The centre of the Competition area shall be indicated with a strip adhesive tape of the same colour.



2.6. LEVEL OF THE JUDGES

The Competition will be judged by EJU qualified Kata Judges.

2.7. INSCRIPTIONS

The number of judges per Federation is limited to:

Participating countries may enter **3 Judges**.

Non participating countries may enter **2 Judges**.

The EJU KATA COMMISSION may decide on the number of Judges according to the entries.

Each participating Federation having qualified EJU Judges has to enter at least one judge.

Only the judges entered by their Federation can judge.

The costs for travelling, board and lodging of the judges are at the costs of the member Federation.

Inscriptions of the Judges have to be sent to the EJU General Secretariat not later than the 30th of September 2011.

An inscription form is enclosed as Form 3.

2.8. JUDGE MEETING

All Judges are to arrive 2 days before the European Kata championships and attend a technical meeting organized on Friday 21st of October 2011 at the Congress Hall of Hotel Duo to confirm participation as judge in these Championships. Only judges are to attend this meeting.

2.9. INJURY, ILLNESS and ACCIDENT

When Tori or Uke is unable to continue because of injury, illness or accident during the execution of the Kata, the couple will be considered out of competition.

In case of Minor injury like bloody wound, broken nail or a problem with contact lenses, according to the decision of the judges, the Kata execution will be stopped and the athlete will be assisted by a Doctor out of the competition area.

The competition will continue and the couple will repeat entirely the Kata soon after the last called couple. In case a new Minor injury happens at the same athletes during the second execution of Kata, the couple will be considered out of competition.

In the case that Minor injury happens after a forgotten technique, the couple will be considered out of competition.

1.1. DATE

The Demonstration will be held in **Prague, Czech Republic** on the **22nd October 2011**.

1.2. KATA

The Kata recognised for the Demonstration are two:

- Koshiki no Kata
- Itsutsu no Kata

1.3. PARTICIPATION

Each federation may enter up to a maximum of 3 pairs per each Kata, totalling up to a maximum of 6 pairs. The participants can do one or both Kata.

The participants must be of the same nationality as the country, which enters them. Participants who have double nationality can only represent only 1 participating country.

1.4. GRADE

The minimum ranking of Tori is 4th Dan.

Couples may be composed of either 2 males, 2 females, or a male and a female.

1.5. REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION MUST BE MADE BY THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AFFILIATED TO THE EUROPEAN JUDO UNION IN JUMAS. REGISTRATION NOT FROM THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AND NOT IN THE JUMAS SYSTEM WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Numerical registration

2. Judges

2.1. SYSTEM OF JUDGING

The demonstration will be evaluated by three judges positioned on the Shomen side.

Each Judge will give a global score from 6 to 10 to each Kata: the result of three judges will be totalled to get the final score reaching a maximum of 30 points.

The demonstration will be on two mats.

If the execution of one or more principles is compromised the total score of the Kata will be minimum 4 and maximum 5.

In case of Forgotten technique the total result of the Kata will be "Zero".

All the pair obtaining a minimum result of 18 points will be awarded with a certificate of "EJU Kata Expert" for the specific Kata with a level of knowledge:

Good	18 – 21 points
Very Good	22 – 26 points
Excellent	27 – 30 points

2.2. LEVEL OF THE JUDGES

The demonstration will be judged by EJU qualified Kata Judges.

Judo Show

1. Technical Information

1.1. DATE

The competition will be held in Prague (Czech Republic) the 23rd of October 2011.

1.2. PARTICIPATION

Each National Federation may enter up to a maximum of 3 Judo-Show teams.

The competitors must be of the same nationality as the country, which enters them.

Competitors who have double nationality can only represent only 1 participating country.

When a competitor changes nationality, he must wait 3 years before he can represent the new country, unless the two countries concerned (the old country and the new country) agree to authorize his entry for the new nationality and this is accepted by the IJF (According to the Olympic charter Art. 42).

1.3. AGE & GRADE

Participants are to be 18 years of age and over, ranking 1st Dan or over.

A team can be composed of male(s) and/or female(s).

1.4. SHOWS

The show is a technical confrontation of fight simulation containing techniques of judo and self-defence.

- Each show can be composed of 2 to 6 competitors
- Each team of judo show will be judged individually on a performance lasting 2 to 3 minutes.
- Should the performance be selected for the finals, it could be carried out with a classical numerical musical support that the candidates will provide to the organizer, during registration.
- During the whole day of competition, the candidates will have to present the same test.
- The accepted equipment is made up with an imitation of traditional weapons of Japanese origin or a gun as in the goshin jitsu.
- The performances are carried out in white judogi in conformity with the regulation of the official competitions.
- Phases of demonstration in slow motion are authorized.

The candidates will have to put forward their technical skills while respecting the judo spirit.

1.5. REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION MUST BE MADE BY THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AFFILIATED TO THE EUROPEAN JUDO UNION IN JUMAS. REGISTRATION NOT FROM THE NATIONAL FEDERATION AND NOT IN THE JUMAS SYSTEM WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

The federations must be in order with the annual fee and other financial obligations to the EJU. The entry fee per competitor must be paid to the EJU. In order to take part at the competition the national federation must have fulfilled the necessary payments to the organizer and the EJU.

b. Control of Entries

Identity: Nationality and age of the participants. (each athlete's passport has to be presented to the EJU official by the representative of the delegation.)

List of entries: The list of entries is confirmed with the EJU official.

No other inscriptions will be accepted after the end of the nation control.

c. Accreditation

A list of all the registered athletes is generated by the JUMAS system, which is confirmed by the head of delegation that it is the final list. (The competitors must only be present at the nation control if they have to make a new Jumas card).

The EJU accreditation cards, which are printed from JUMAS, must be presented before each demonstration.

1.7. CLOTHING

The competitions will be held in white judogi.

Judogi Control:

- Clean judogi in good repair and of correct dimensions
- No old back numbers on jackets
- EJU Judo-Show Championship back numbers on back of jacket
- Zori or mules as part of the uniform

Long hair has to be bound with an elastic band.

Spectacles and jewellery are prohibited.

The nails have to be cut short.

The women competitors must wear a white non-transparent T-shirt. The bras must not have any hard pieces. Make-up is not allowed.

1.8. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FEDERATIONS

d. Medical certificate

The gender certificate and the medical certificate of the participants are not required.

The participants will compete under the full responsibility of the federations.

e. Insurance

Each national federation is responsible for insuring its competitors against « injury and third part risk (public liability) » during the period of the championships.

The European Judo Union declines all responsibility

f. Attitude of the competitors

The member-Federations are responsible for the behaviour and attitude of their competitors at the championships.

1.9. ANTI-DOPING

No anti-doping tests are done at the Kata European Championships.

1.10. FREE ACCREDITATION

Each Delegation will be given 2 free accreditations.

Each National Federation will be provided with another 2 free VIP accreditations for the President and the General Secretary of the Federation.



Section C ***Judo Show***

2. Judges

2.1. COMPETITION FORMULA

The top three teams with the maximum points will be awarded the gold medal and will be the European Champion, the second will be awarded the silver medal; and the third the Bronze medal.

2.2. POINT SYSTEM

The show will be judged on the following criteria:

- efficiency
- precision and variety of the techniques
- choreographies
- originality

The total points accumulated will be the final result.

2.3. COMPETITION AREA

The Competition area has dimensions 10 x 10 metres and shall be covered by Tatami or similar acceptable material. When more adjoining competition areas are used, a common safety area of 2 metres is necessary.

2.4. SYSTEM OF JUDGING

Every Judo-show will be controlled by five Kata Judges, one of them acting as the head judge. Each judge will award points on the official EJU scoring sheet. The Maximum points and the Minimum Points awarded are cancelled and the remaining three are totaled to get the final number of penalties.

All of them should be coordinated by the Head of the Education and Coaching commission.

The Competition will be on one mat.

2.5. LEVEL OF THE JUDGES

The contests will be judged by EJU qualified Kata Judges.

2.6. REGISTRATION

The number of judges per federation is limited to:

Participating countries may enter **3 Judges**.

Non participating countries may enter **2 Judges**.

The organizing country may enter **4 Judges**.

The EJU KATA and SHOWS COMMISSION may decide on the number of Judges according to the entries.

Each participating federation has to enter at least one judge.

Only the judges entered by their federation can judge.

The costs for traveling, board and lodging of the judges are at the costs of the member federation.

Inscriptions of the Judges have to be sent to the EJU General Secretariat not later than Monday of the week before the championships. For the exact date, please check Annex 2.

An inscription form is enclosed as Form 3.

2.7. JUDGES MEETING

All Judges are to arrive Two days before the World Kata championships and attend a technical meeting organized on **Friday 21st of October 2011** at the at the Congress Hall of Hotel Duo to confirm participation as judge in these Championships. Only judges are to attend this meeting.

2.2.1. Entry Fee

The federations must pay an entry fee as listed in the various sections.

Form 2 must be sent to the organisers. The nominal inscriptions must also be entered into Jumas. In case the participant (official or competitor) has no nominal inscription (jumas entry), no participation is possible.

If the competitor with the nominal inscription is injured, the Federation has to present a Medical Doctor certificate of the injured competitor. Once confirmed, that place can be used for another competitor of the same function (e.g. a competitor shall be replaced by another competitor, even from a different category and / or sex), or in case of no competitor, participation fee shall be reimbursed.

If the competitor with nominal inscriptions will not take part, and the Federation has a Medical Doctor certificate, the 1st Case will be applied. If no Medical Doctor certificate is available, the participations fees will be not be returned.

2.3.2. Form 3 – Judges Inscription

In the case that a referee from your federation is nominated, confirmation must be sent by the date stipulated on the letter. These referees must be entered in Jumas.

2.3.3. Form 4 – Media Inscription

Journalists must send in their media inscription to both EJU General Secretariat & Organisers in order to receive accreditation.

2.3.4. Form 6 – Travel Schedule & Transfers

Only delegations arriving in airports / train stations / harbours defined in section 6 and advising the organisers on time will be transferred to the hotel by the organisers.
