Hotel Infomation

All participants in the Grand Pix 2011 in Düsseldorf must stay in one of the official hotels. Reservation at the official Hotels must be booked exclusively through the Organizer on a first come first serve basis. Please be informed that the hotel situation in Düsseldorf is very strained and that it will be strongly necessary to book the accommodation asap. Hotelreservation must be made before Dezember 16th 2010. Full payment mus be received before January 15th 2011. If payment is made after this date surcharge of 10% will be levied upon the total payable amount. Possible reservations of extra rooms at the check-in will also be surcharged with 10%. NO exceptions will be made. All bank fees and bank transfer costs are to be paid by the participation federation.

Cancellation fees: In case of of cancellation, the following cancellation fee will apply

From 5 February: 100 % (full Charge)

Cancellations of rooms cannot be made at the check-in. Injuries, visa problems or sickness are not valid reasons for cancellation of rooms.

Düsseldorf

Düsseldorf ranks among the leading cities of the world where quality of life is concerned (6th in a study carried out by Mercer Human Resource Consulting). That's why this city on the banks of the Rhine isn't only enjoying strong population growth, it's also welcoming increasing numbers of tourists and business travellers.

Business and Science

Düsseldorf as a business centre lies at the heart of the Rhine-Ruhr region with its 11.5 million residents and 400,000 businesses within an hour's drive. One hundred and forty-eight million people live within a radius of 500 kilometres. That's 35% of the European Union's total population. Second only to London and Paris, Düsseldorf is the European metropolitan region that possesses the largest market volume and highest spending power. Düsseldorf is the most innovative business location in Germany — even ranking above Munich and Hamburg. With one of the densest university and research landscapes in Germany, the city is able to guarantee a highly qualified workforce and innovative power. Düsseldorf's universities have shaped the city thanks to their famous research facilities (these are: Heinrich-Heine University, the Düsseldorf University of Applied Sciences, the Arts Academy and the Robert-Schumann Conservatory).

Trade Fair and Congress Destination

The Düsseldorf trade fair organises more than 40 international trade fairs on the "machines, plants and equipment", "retail, trade and services", "health and medicine", "fashion and lifestyle" and "leisure" sectors. More than 23 of these events are international leaders, i.e. they are the most important shows in their respective field ... because this is where the world-market's supply and demand come together in a single location.

Düsseldorf is able to offer an exhibition area totalling 307,000 m2 of which 252,000 m2 are in 19 trade-fair halls that have been laid out as a closed hall circuit. In 2008, 27,704 exhibitors presented their products and services to more than 1.4 million visitors from all over the world. The proportion of international visitors totalled 29%, the share of international exhibitors was even higher with 56%. The Düsseldorf Congress, the largest location provider in Northrhine- Westphalia, is also a great attraction. With its LTU arena, ISS DOME, Burg-Wächter Castello and Philipshalle, Düsseldorf possesses the most modern venue infrastructure in Germany. The arena alone has a seating capacity of 51,500, which with the inner area that's used at music concerts, may be increased to up to 61,000.

Location and Accessibility

The city on the banks of the Rhine possesses an excellent infrastructure as well as outstanding transport links. With 180 destinations, Düsseldorf International Airport is the third-largest airport in Germany. Each year, 144,000 planes fly to European destinations. Direct flights are available to London Heathrow, London City, London Stansted, Manchester, Birmingham,

Newcastle, Southampton and Leeds-Bradford. The city lies on one of the largest waterways in Europe, the Rhine, and the Neuss-Düsseldorf harbours are the third-largest inland harbours in Europe. And in regard to rail transport, Düsseldorf's main station offers more than 190 daily express connections to national and international destinations. It's only two hours by rail to Amsterdam and Brussels, just four to Paris.

Culture and Lifestyle

But Düsseldorf is not only the region's most important business location, it's also a centre for fashion, culture and lifestyle: Düsseldorf is famed throughout the world for its unique shopping opportunities on the chestnut-lined Königsallee and in the historic Old Town.

Particularly during the Christmas season, when the atmospheric Christmas Market comes to town, the city centre becomes doubly attractive as a top shopping venue. And, in the evenings, there's always something going on in the Old Town: the "longest bar in the world" with more than 260 restaurants, bars and pubs is home to "Alt"beer – a genuine Düsseldorf speciality. Over recent years, the chic Media Harbour with its crooked Gehry Buildings and many fashionable restaurants and bars has also become a popular place for nights out. Schloss Benrath is also a great attraction with it's late-baroque ensemble of palace and park.

There's always something going on in Düsseldorf. For instance, "schunkeln" – swaying rhythmically with the music – during the Carnival season when millions of people turn out to party in fancy dress and processions with magnificent floats from which it "rains" sweets roll through the streets. In summer, the "Schützen" – sports shooters – organise highly traditional processions accompanied by horses. The occasion is the Largest Fun Fair on the banks of the Rhine with looping roller-coaster and high-speed wild water course which attracts people from all over. Japan Day – the day when pyrotechnicians from the Far East create magnificent fireworks displays. The FIS Cross-Country Skiing World Cup on the Rhine embankment at the end of the year now belongs just as much to Düsseldorf as snow does to winter sports.
