Late Athlete Replacement Policy (LAR)

Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) is a process of athletes' replacement after the Sport Entries deadline (5 July 2019). The replacement of athletes is possible if:

1. The replacement athlete is eligible to take part in the Baku 2019 European Youth Olympic Festival;
2. No doping control issues are pending concerning the replacement athlete;
3. The NOC of the replacement athlete had applied for accreditation for the athlete prior to the accreditation application deadline.

The **medical replacement** of athletes is possible after 5 July 2019 and up to 2 hours prior to the Sport Technical Meeting, weigh-in or draw as appropriate.

The **non-medical replacement** of athletes is possible after 5 July 2019 and up to 24 hours prior to the Sport Technical Meeting, weigh-in or draw as appropriate.

Each NOC shall be allocated a quota for non-medical replacements based upon the NOC overall number of athletes:

Team Size (Aa)	Quota of Non-Medical LAR
From 1-10	1
From 11-20	2
From 21-50	5
From 51-100	10
From 101-150	15
From 151-200	20
201+	30

Note: The quotas provided above do not cover Basketball, Handball, Volleyball athlete replacements. However, athlete replacements in these sports should also be processed through the Baku-2019 Sport Entries. LAR procedure remains the same for Basketball, Handball, and Volleyball as for other sports.

The procedure of athlete replacement due to both medical and non-medical reasons is as following:

1. NOC Representatives should provide the dedicated NOC Relations Manager with the duly filled in “Late Athlete Replacement Form” via email or submit personally to the Baku 2019 Sports Information Desk (in the case of Medical Replacement, a Medical certificate is required).
2. The Baku 2019 NOC Relations team will forward all received queries to the Baku 2019 Sport Entries team to proceed accordingly.
3. The requested replacement shall be approved by the Technical Delegate for the relevant sport, on behalf of the European Federation.
4. The accreditation card of the replaced athlete must be returned to the Accreditation Centre, in order to allow for the entitlements to be transferred to the replacement athlete. Following the transfer, the replaced athlete's accreditation will be deactivated.

Once a replacement athlete has been approved, that individual athlete cannot be replaced for non-medical reasons.

Doping Control

At the European Youth Olympic Festival organized in Baku, Azerbaijan in 2019, Sample Collection Authority (SCA) is the Azerbaijan National Anti-Doping Agency (AMADA). Athletes may be tested during the entire period, regardless of their location. AMADA acknowledges its conformity with the International Standard for Testing and Investigations (ISTI) and anti-doping activities to fulfil its role and responsibilities under the Code.

Therapeutic Use Exemption

Athletes who need to use a prohibited medication to treat a legitimate medical condition must send the TUE Application to the relative Anti-Doping Organization at least 30 days prior to the competition.

All TUE permits have to be approved by the TUE Committee of the European Olympic Committee, attaching the relevant medical documentation in the English language. It is responsibility of the athlete to determine whether a substance he/she is using or considering using is prohibited. TUE must be sent to tuebaku2019@eventoc.az no later than 19 June 2019. TUE permit must be presented to the doping control officers during the doping control procedure.

For In-Competition, there is a possibility of issuing instant TUE permits in exceptional medical cases, the assessment of which will be done by the EYOF TUE Committee.

TUE application forms will be distributed to all NOCs, NOCs can also request this form from tuebaku2019@eventoc.az e-mail address.

Participation in the EYOF Baku 2019 is open to all European young athletes nominated by their NOC, subject to the current Charter, the Technical regulations of the EYOF and the guidelines established by the Organising Committee, duly approved by the EOC.

Any competitor in the EYOF must be a national or citizen of the country or territory of the NOC, which is entering him or her.

A NOC who wishes to enter an athlete, who does not meet these criteria, may submit a written and detailed request to the EOC EYOF Commission not later than two months before the date of the Opening Ceremony at 21 July 2019.

Each athlete's IJF Judobase Number, Height and Weight should be added into the Sport Entries System till 5 July 2019.

Competition Format

The Judo Competition at EYOF 2019 will consist of the following events and corresponding weight categories:

Individual Events

- Boys: -50 kg, -55 kg, -60 kg, -66 kg, -73 kg, -81 kg, -90 kg, +90 kg
- Girls: -40kg, -44 kg, -48 kg, -52 kg, -57 kg, -63 kg, -70 kg, +70 kg

Team Event

- Mixed Team Event (Girls: -48 kg, -63 kg, +63 kg; Boys: -60 kg, -81 kg, +81 kg)

Individual Events

The competition will be carried out according to the rules and sporting codes of the IJF and EJU using the direct elimination system with double repechage.

An elimination system will be used to produce two finalists who will compete for the gold medal. The athletes defeated by four semi-finalists will gradually enter rounds of repechage contests. The

two winners of repechage finals will compete in two bronze medal contests against the losers of the semi-finals of the respective opposite table:

- The winners (2) of those contests are placed third
- The losers (2) are placed fifth
- The losers (2) of the repechage finals are placed seventh

The draw will be conducted during the Technical Meeting on 23 July 2019; the time and the place will be specified prior to Event.

Coaches

All coaches must fully adhere to the Code of Conduct for Judo Coaches.

Dress Code for Elimination rounds and Final Block is national track suit with trousers reaching down to shoes and track suit jacket or NOC T-shirt with long or short sleeves.

The following are forbidden at any time: shorter trousers, undressed upper body, any kind of head caps and cover, jeans, sweaters or similar sports unrelated dress, flip-flops.

Mixed Team Event

Only the athletes competing in EYOF Baku 2019 individual events are eligible to be entered in team list. The NOCs must submit their Mixed Team entry from 15 May – 5 July together with Short list.

The team should consist of 6 (six) athletes, one in every official mixed team weight category, and has the possibility to have up to six (6) reserves, 3 girls and 3 boys. Only full teams with athletes in all 6 (six) weight categories will be accepted. If there are injuries or illness during the individual competition a team can compete with a minimum of four (4) athletes

Team weight categories for mixed team event are as below:

- Girls: -48 kg, -63 kg, +63 kg
- Boys: -60 kg, -81 kg, +81 kg

The weight of the competitors has to fall within the mixed team category in which they are enrolled. Judoka have to compete in their inscribed mixed team category and CANNOT be moved up to one category higher.

During the contest the non-competing athletes must stay within a marked area on the FOP behind the coaches' chair. Reserve athletes must not enter the Field of Play.

The lists of the mixed team for each contest shall consists of three (3) female athletes and three (3) male athletes.

Competition Format

The Competition will be held using the Double Repechage System.

Pre-competition procedures

Technical Meeting

The JU Technical Meeting and Draw shall be held on 23 July 2019 at 14:00-16:00. The place will be specified prior to the competition.

At least one official or delegate from each participating NOC must attend the draw; a maximum of two delegates per NOC will be authorized (plus attaché or an interpreter, if necessary).

EJU Technical Delegates will lead the Technical Meeting and the meeting will be held in the English language.

The Technical Meeting Agenda

- Opening, Welcome by EJU President and/or NF President
- Presentation of delegates and officials in charge of JU events
- Presentation of NOCs attending
- Official Draw Individual and Team
- Schedule
- Protests and appeals
- Refereeing matters
- Judogi rule and control
- Doping control
- Opening, closing and victory ceremonies
- Response to the questions in writing

Referees

Each NOC participating in judo must nominate one referee. The NOC should nominate their referee from the first 100 referees of EJU Referee Ranking by 31 March 2019.

The EJU Refereeing Commission will appoint eighteen (18) referees and three (3) reserve referees out of all nominees and will contact the EOC and the OC to notify them which referees have been selected. The OC will subsequently inform the NOCs.

In case one of the referees cannot attend the EYOF a substitute from reserve referees will be invited.

The NOCs participating in JU competition (with at least one athlete) will share the travel and accommodation costs of these eighteen (18) nominated referees (including the participation fee per person per day).

NOC is responsible for international travel of nominated referees. The costs for travel must be communicated to the OC.

NOC is also responsible for registration of referee in RAS.

The accommodation and local travel will be arranged by the OC.

The OC will charge each NOC participating in Judo with a “referee fee” that includes the share for travel costs and participation fee (80 Euro per person and day) by an invoice.

No fees/per diem are paid to the referees.

All Referees must bring uniforms that conform to the requirements of the International Federation.

Referees Meeting

The Referee Meeting will be held on 23 July 2019, after the Technical Meeting at AVL.

The attendance to the Referee meeting is compulsory.

The referees should be dressed formally for this meeting.

Competition Refereeing

There will be one Referee Commissioner per mat.

The contest shall be conducted by one referee and two judges of differing nationalities from the competing athletes.

The referee stands on the tatami with a radio communication system that is connected with the two judges at the mat table and Referee Director.

They will be assisted through the Computer-aided Replay (CARE) system.

The EJU Jury will intervene only when they consider it necessary to do so.

Refereeing Rules

The current IJF Refereeing Rules will be apply.

Special Refereeing Rules for Cadets.

Application of kansetsu-waza is allowed and should continue until Maitta, tapping twice or the contestant is incapacitated by the effect of kansetsu-waza.

Application of shime waza is allowed. An athlete who has lost consciousness due to shime waza is not allowed to continue the competition.

Bow

The contestants must not shake hands BEFORE the start of the contest.

When the athletes are leaving the mat they must wear judogi in proper way and are not allowed to take out any part of the judogi or the belt before leaving the Field of Play.

Duration of Contest

The duration of each contest will be four minutes for boys and girls.

No time limit for Golden Score.

Draw

Draw shall be held during the Technical Meeting on 23 July 2019 at 14:00-16:00. NOCs will be informed about the room of draw prior to the competition.

Before the draw the lists of each category are hung in the draw room or in the corridor outside the draw room.

Each Team Leader is responsible to check that all his inscribed competitors are on these lists and that they are under the right category.

Procedure

The draw will be done by computer with the official software approved by the EJU/IJF.

The top four among the entered competitors in each weight category will be seeded according Cadets IJF World Ranking List after the Cadet Judo European Championships 27 – 30 June 2019 in Warsaw.

The sets of draws results can be picked up at the Sport Information Desk (SID). Two sets will be given to each delegation.

No corrections can be made after the draw.

Weigh-In

Official scales will be available for test weigh-in daily from 08:00 to 22:00. in Athletes Villages and in the Competition Venue.

The official weigh-in for athletes shall be held at Athletes' Village the day before competition for categories concerned according to the competition schedule.

Athletes must present their EYOF Baku 2019 accreditation card and his/her passport (National ID Card showing nationality, picture and date of birth are also accepted).

The unofficial weigh-in takes place before the official weigh-in, from 18:30 to 19:00.

The official weigh-in will take place from 19:00 to 19:30. The weight of the athletes has to fall within the category for which they have been entered. The weigh-in will take place in Athletes Village and NOCs will be informed about the specific areas later.

Athletes are not allowed to weigh-in naked. Boys must wear at least underwear and girls at least underwear and a T-shirt. Additional 100 g will be allowed for their weight category limits.

The competitors will weigh-in under the supervision of a weigh-in official of the same gender. The weigh-in will be under the control of the EJU Technical Delegate.

Random weight checks of 4 (four) athletes per weight category (except for the + categories) with the same rules as the official weigh-in will be organised before the first contests in the morning of the competition. The athletes must present their accreditation card. The weight of the athlete cannot be more than 5% higher (without judogi) than the official maximum weight limit of the category.

The athletes who present themselves after the weigh-in has closed, will not be allowed to participate in the competition

The athletes can only stand on the scales during the official weigh-in once

Mixed Team Event

All NOCs who will take part in the individual event with 3 girls and 3 boys in mix team weight categories will qualified for the mix team competition. The NOCs must submit their Mixed Team entry from 15 May – 5 July together with Short list.

Weigh-In of Teams

The official weigh-in shall be held the day before the team event according to competition schedule. The competitors will be permitted a 2 kg tolerance in their official team weight categories.

The competitors inscribed in team weight categories girls +63 kg and boys -81,+81 kg and competing on 26 July in the individual events girls -70 and +70 kg and boys -81,-90 and +90 kg will NOT be required to come for the official weigh-in for team competition on evening of 26 July 2019.

Draw for mixed team event

The draw will take place on 23 July 2019 at 14:00 – 16:00 together with draw for individual events.

The four (4) medal winning teams of the Cadet Mixed Team European Judo Championships 2019 will be seeded.

Decision

The first team to reach the majority of 4 (four) wins is declared winner. The remaining contest will not be fought.

It is compulsory that all athletes listed for the match compete until the team reaches the winning result. If an athlete refuses to compete the team will be disqualified.

If one team does not arrive for a match, the other team will be declared the winner

In case of equal wins in the end, one weight category will be drawn for immediate golden score.

Confirmation of team lists

Final confirmation of the team lists will be done on 26 July 2019, the last day of individual events during the announced time in the competition venue.

The Team official must sign the final list of athletes.

Line-ups of Teams

The basic sequence of the mixed team categories: -48 kg, -60kg, -63 kg, -81kg, +63 kg, +81 kg. During the team draw an additional draw will decide which mixed team category will start the team contests in the first round. The next higher category will follow.

Before each round the team coach must present the line-up of the team to the Technical Delegate.

An athlete cannot be rested for one team match and return for the next unless he is replaced by a reserve athlete.

For the first round the team lists must be returned at least 30 minutes before the start of the competition. For other rounds it must be returned 5 minutes after receiving the list from Technical Delegate. Once it is returned to Technical Delegate it cannot be changed.

Coaches: two coaches are allowed with FOP with the team.

A competitor, who has presented himself for the contest and refuses to compete loses the right to compete in the event.

Withdrawal by Injury

Withdrawal by injury must be indicated to the EJU Technical Delegate at the venue in writing on the official withdrawal form.

During eliminations

- if the responsibility for the injury cannot be attributed to one of the competitors, the injured fighter will lose the contest
- if the responsibility for the injury is attributed to one of the competitors, the other competitor will be declared the winner. The competitor responsible for the injury will not be able to participate in the repechage
- in the event of a withdrawal, the competitor will not be allowed to present himself for the following contests

During the finals or semi-finals

- if the responsibility for the injury cannot be attributed to one of the competitors, the injured competitor will lose the contest
- if the responsibility of the injury is attributed to one of the competitors, the other competitor will be declared the winner

Direct Hansokumake

In the event of a direct hansokumake against the spirit of judo, a joint decision by the Technical Delegate and Refereeing Director will be taken. In this case, the Judoka will not receive a medal and no ranking points for the tournament in question.

Note: A competitor who has lost as a result of an injury can continue the competition. A competitor, who has got a direct hansoku-make as the penalty against the spirit of our sport, will not be allowed to continue in the competition.

Competition Procedures

Athletes will be called to warm-up before their contest according to the procedure detailed below:

Judogi control in the Call Room will be the last activity before athletes enter the field of play. Athletes will be required to show their accreditation in the call room to verify their identity. In accordance with rules, athletes may be accompanied.

Post Competition Information

Leaving the field of play

Athletes will be escorted from the field of play by their field of play officials. The athlete in white will walk to the front of the competition area and wait for the athlete in blue.

Data and timing systems

OC will provide a computerized Data & Timing & Scoring and Results Service approved by the respective sport's European Federation.

Results

The results will be published in English.

Results Print Distribution volunteers will deliver the agreed number of copies (usually one or two) of results outputs to agreed locations. The delivery of printed results information is available only at competition venues and to time-critical services. Selected reports will be available for collection from Sport Information Desks at competition venues. According to the distribution timeline, the results outputs will be compiled in PDF format and made available for download from the official EYOF Baku 2019 website.

The programme for the following day will be made available at the NOC Service Centre at Athletes' Village, in the competition venues at the Sport Information Desks as well as at the official EYOF Baku 2019 website.

Start and result lists location and distribution

OC will be responsible for the Back Numbers and any other identification of athletes and coaches, for start and finish installations and other sport equipment in the venues.

Medal Ceremonies

Medal ceremonies shall be held directly following the end of the event finals at Heydar Aliyev Arena.

Medal Ceremonies will be held at the competition venue, the dates and times will be indicated in the daily competitions schedule prior to the event.

The medal ceremonies will consist of the following:

- medal podium
- gold, silver and two bronze medals for individual events
- 12 x gold, 12 x silver and 24 x bronze medals for mixed team events (two third places)
- flags (first to third) and national anthem of the winning athlete's/team's nation
- photo opportunity for the accredited media

All Medal Ceremonies will occur on or around field of play. Announcements will be made in both English and Azerbaijani

Athlete Escorts will lead athletes to the podium for the Medal Ceremony and will provide direction with regards to the procedures that the athletes will need to follow. Flags, signs, mobile phones, cameras, electronic devices, bottles, items of sport equipment, political statements and accreditations will not be allowed on the podium. If any athlete is in possession of any of these items, they must be passed to the Medal Ceremonies Manager for the duration of the Ceremony. Similarly, if any items are thrown to an athlete while they are on the field of play and/or the podium, the athlete must pass them to their athlete escort, for them to hold during the Medal Ceremony.

After the Medal Ceremony has finished, athletes will be asked to move to a second location in order to provide the media with additional photography opportunities. If any athletes are notified for doping control, they will be escorted by a Doping Control Officer and chaperoned to the Doping Control Station.

The medals will be presented to athletes only. No medals will be provided for officials.

Competition and Training schedule

During the Festival there may be delays, postponements or cancellations of the competition. Should this occur, NOCs will be informed of the revised competition schedule through the Sport Information Center at the Athlete Village and the Sport Information Desk at the competition venue.

The open training opportunity is available between 21 – 26 July, 10:00 – 18:00.

The JU athletes will get training opportunity between 21-26 July in the Training Hall of Heydar Aliyev Arena. During the competition days 24 – 26 July the training will be open from 12:30 to athletes not competing on particular days.

There will be no training opportunity on the last day of the JU competition.

EYOF Baku 2019 Brand protection regulations

Clothing and Advertising

Judogis must be in accordance with IJF Judogi Rules (material & size) and EJU Judogi Rules (Edition EYOF 2019 - markings). The athlete called first has to wear a white Judogi and the second a blue Judogi.

All Judoka must compete in IJF Approved Judogi (Judogis from all IJF suppliers are allowed - see www.ijf.org - Official Supplier List). The Judogi must have the official IJF label "APPROVED JUDOGI" in RED with the correct optical code. The label will be controlled with an optical lamp. Each of the competition clothing articles (jacket, trousers and belt) must have the official IJF label. The jacket and the trousers must be of the same brand (belt can be of a different brand). Exception: As not all Suppliers can provide coloured belts (blue, brown) with the official label, only a black belt has to have the official

IJF label "APPROVED JUDOGI".

Each competitor will get the official EYOF Baku 2019 backnumber sewed on both the white and the blue judogi. Competitors are obliged to bring their clean Judogi (without any backnumber or sticker) to the sewing service in the Athletes village.

Judogi will be checked prior to every fight with a Sokuteiki for compliance with the size requirements stated in the IJF Judogi Rules.

All coaches must fully adhere to the Code of Conduct for Judo Coaches. The Dress Code for the Elimination rounds and Final Block: National track suit with trousers reaching down to shoes and track suit jacket or NOC T-shirt with long or short sleeves. The shorter trousers, undressed upper body, any kind of head caps and cover, jeans, sweaters or similar sports unrelated dress, flip-flops are forbidden at any time.

In accordance with the EYOF Charter, Rule 20 and By-laws to Rule 20a no form of advertising or publicity may appear in any form whatsoever on clothing, accessories or, more generally, on any item of clothing or piece of equipment worn or carried by the delegations and organisers during EYOF, with the exception of the manufacturer's identification and logo, as stipulated in rule No. 50

of the IOC Charter. All violations of the provisions of this clause shall lead to disqualification and the withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

The only exceptions are a graphics or graphics elements of the manufacturer's brand identification that may exceed the restricted size; e.g. three stripes (and similar cases of "commercial brand graphics element") as well as other Product Technology Identifications such as "Goretex" and Dryfit" and similar cases having direct relation to the clothing identification. In this case it is strongly advised to send pictures featuring such branding to the EOC Sport Director for review and official approval.

The NOCs are requested to bring a sample of the competition uniform to the first Technical meeting of each sport for final check in order to avoid any problems on the field of play.

The official uniforms of the NOCs may include:

- Symbols of the country (name of the country, national flag, emblem, etc.)
- Emblem of the NOC
- Logo of the EYOF Baku 2019
- Emblem of the respective National Sport Federations

Please note that the NOC is responsible for the appearance of the official uniforms. For more details please refer to the Rule 50 and By-laws to Rule 50 of the IOC Charter and the EYOF Rules on Advertising, Demonstrations and Propaganda, applicable to the EYOF 2019 in Baku.

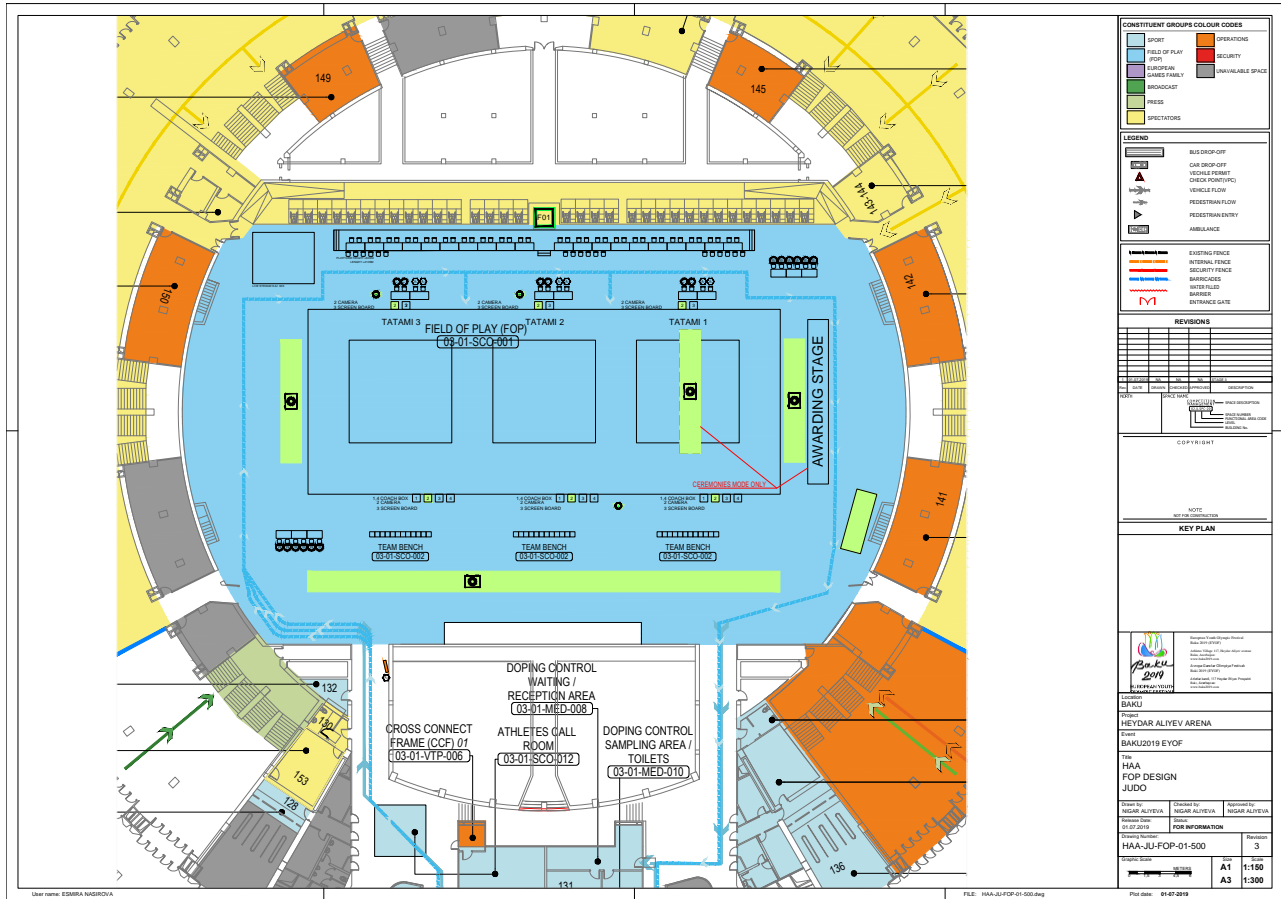

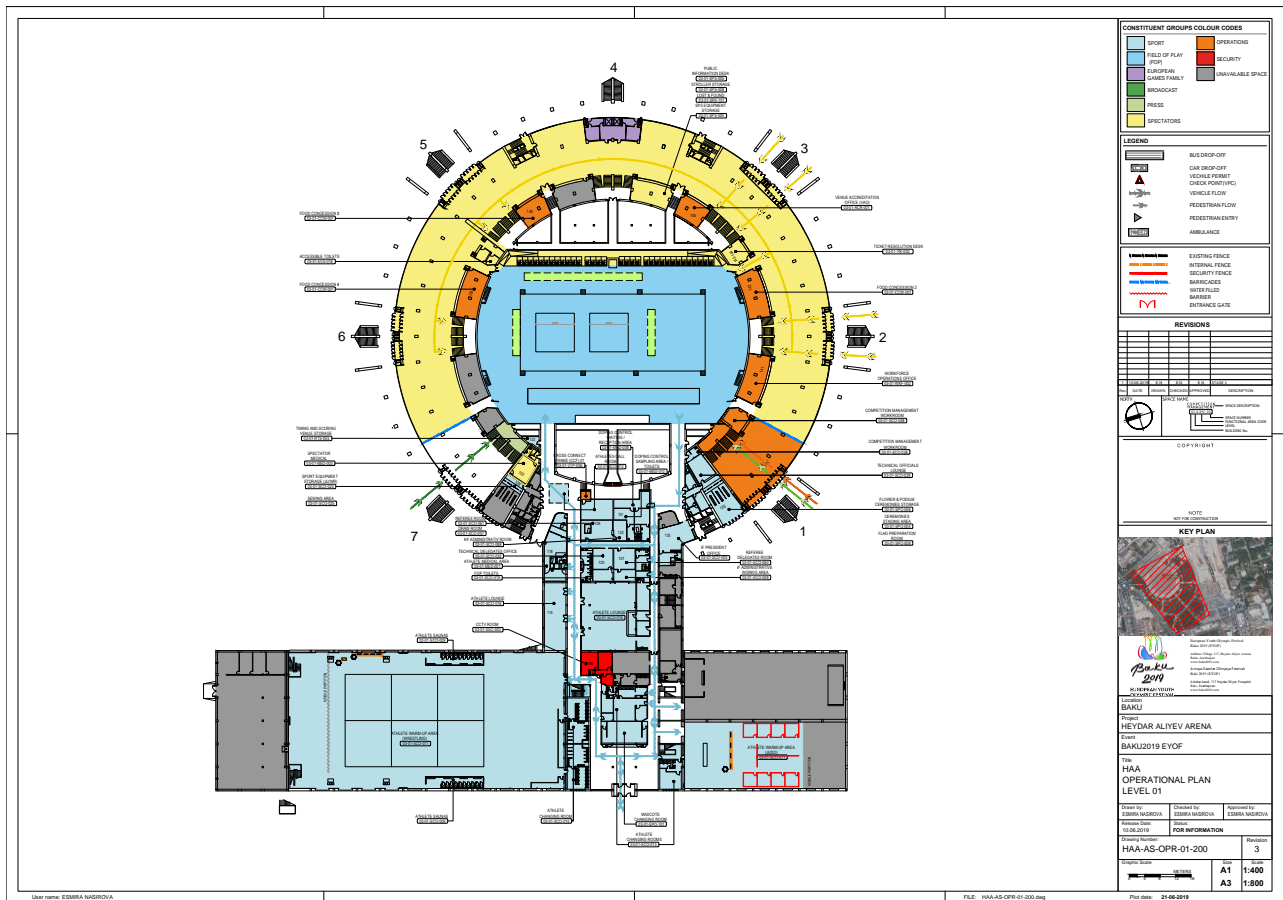

Venue access:

The athlete transport system (T-A) buses will use the athlete load zone. A complete timetable of bus services for Judo competition and training sessions will be available in the Athlete Village at the Sport Information Centre

Field of play:

Competition will be held on three mats. During the Final sessions only two mats will be used.

Weather information

Due to its location on the southwest Absheron Peninsula, Baku is characterized by its warm temperatures and strong winds all year long, and summers are usually hot and dry. Based on statistics from previous years, the mean temperature is approximately 28°C in July.

Athletes Lounge

Located on the second floor.

Athletes Refreshments

Refreshments will be available in the Athlete Lounge from the first day of venue training to the final day of competition, from 60 minutes before the competition session begins until 30 minutes after.

Tea and coffee, whole fruit (bananas, apples and oranges), biscuits (packaged) energy bars (e.g. granola bars or similar), still water (500ml) and soft drinks (500ml) are provided.

This is self-service, monitored and replenished by client group volunteers during opening times. Athletes' venue meals will be lunch box.

Athletes' changing rooms.

Changing rooms for athletes located on the ground floor is two rooms 1 for boys and 1 for girls.

Athlete Medical Services at competition venue

Medical care for athletes will be provided at all competition venues from 1 hour before the start of competition or training to one hour after the competition or training has finished, or until all athletes leave the venue.

Field of Play Medical Team will be present at every competition venue, with further medical care being provided via a doctor and nurse in Athlete Medical Room. Emergency medical care and, if needed, hospitalization will be provided through an ambulance.

Technical Officials' lounge and refreshments

The Technical Officials' lounge is located on level 1. Refreshments will be available in the Technical Officials' lounge from the first day of competition to the final day of competition, from 60 minutes before competition session begins until 30 minutes after. Tea and coffee, whole fruit (bananas, apples and oranges), biscuits (packaged), Still Water (500ml) and soft drinks (500ml) are provided. This is self-service, monitored and replenished by client group volunteers during opening times

Technical Officials' Meeting Room

The Technical Officials' meeting room, located on level 1, close to the technical officials' lounge, will be available on competition days.

Technical Officials' changing rooms

The Technical Officials' changing rooms are located on level 1, close to the technical officials' lounge. There are two changing rooms, one male and one female with showers and toilets.

Lost and Found

All reports of lost items in the sport areas at Heydar Aliyev Arena should be directed to the Sport Information Desk (SID). This is also the location to which all found items should be delivered.

Training venue access

The athlete transport system (T-A) buses will use the athlete load zone. A complete timetable of bus services for Judo competition and training sessions will be available in the Athlete Village at the Sport Information Centre.

Athlete training opportunities:

The training is on an open base from 10:00 to 18:00.

There will be no training opportunity on the last day of the JU competition.

Athletes Lounge

A lounge for athletes and their support staff is located on level 2 and is available for athletes on days they are competing. The lounge will be open during operational hours that athletes and officials are present at the venue for competition and official training. The athlete lounge will open from 09:00 – 20:00.

Athletes' refreshments

Refreshments will be available in the Athlete Lounge from the first day of venue training to the final day of competition, from 60 minutes before the competition session begins until 30 minutes after. Tea and coffee, whole fruit (bananas, apples and oranges), biscuits (packaged) energy bars (e.g. granola bars or similar), still water (500ml) and soft drinks (500ml) are provided.

This is self-service, monitored and replenished by client group volunteers during opening times

Athletes' venue meals

Athlete Venue Meals (AVMs) will be available for athletes who will be away from the AVL for more than four hours. Meals must be ordered from the NOC Help Desk in the NOC Services Centre 48 hours in advance.

Still water will be available for athletes undergoing doping control or medical treatment.

Athletes' changing rooms

Two changing rooms, one each for male and female athletes, are located next to the warm-up area. Each changing room has full shower and toilet facilities.

Medical Services at Training Venues

Medical care at training venues will be provided only for official training via an ambulance service positioned on site. For medical support outside of official training an ambulance can be called via dialing 103.

Visa to Azerbaijan

All NOC delegation members participating in the event may obtain a travel visa from one of the Azerbaijani diplomatic missions, unless they come from one of the visa exempt countries, countries eligible for visa on arrival or countries eligible for electronic visa.

E-Visa for Azerbaijan, also known as the ASAN visa, can be obtained by completing the online application at <http://www.evisa.gov.az> with personal information, travel details, passport data and security questions before online payment. The approved e-Visa for Azerbaijan is then sent to the applicant's e-mail address within three (3) business days.

Please, note that the e-Visa issued will be for single entry to Azerbaijan with a validity period of 90 days. The period of stay cannot exceed 30 days.

Transport

Arrivals and Departures

During arrivals and departures, T-A, T-F system will run a Transfer service from/to Heydar Aliyev International Airport (GYD), AVL and Boulevard hotel, based on Arrivals and Departures schedule. All eligible festival travelers landing at Heydar Aliyev International airport will be met and welcomed by EYOF 'BAKU 2019' OC staff and volunteers. They will be assisted on their way through the airport to find the right direction, collect their luggage, go through customs and board their type of transport accordingly. In case of any issues or any questions requiring further clarification, the guests can present themselves at BAKU 'EYOF 2019' Welcome Desk, where the staff can accept queries and provide assistance accordingly.

Athletes will be able to validate their accreditation at AVL.

T – A Transport System (Athletes and Team Officials):

- Transport from/to Baku Airport and the Athletes Village during Arrivals and Departures;
- Non-Team Sports – shuttle buses will run from the Athletes' Village to/from all competition and training venues according to the defined schedule;
- Team Sports – dedicated team buses will be provided for Volleyball, Basketball and Handball teams to transfer athletes from/to the Athletes Village and the Competition & Training Venues during the EYOF 2019;
- Pre-scheduled Transport Shuttle/Transfer service from Athletes Village to/from Competition & Training Venues;
- Non-Team Sports - spectating athletes may use the bus services assigned for competing athletes;
- Team Sports - the scheduled bus services will be in place for spectating athletes, separately;
- Free access to the Public Transport System (Metro & Buses);
- The "clean to clean", concept, will be adopted throughout all Venues and the Athletes Village Transport Mall;
- All Athletes movements are secure and will require a vehicle screening at all Competition and Training Venues (max. 1 minute);
- No vehicle screening at the Airport and at the Athletes Village Transport Mall (AML).

Opening & Closing Ceremonies

- The 50 seats buses will be used for transporting Athletes and Team officials. The buses will be assigned to each participating country and will arrive to venue according to the agreed ceremonies plan.
- The Transfer of the EOC Family, Local Dignitaries and T-F Transport system users to/from the Crystal Hall will be implemented by coaches based on preliminary agreed plan.
- The Access and Parking of the private cars around the Crystal Hall will be prohibited.
- The other accredited client groups will use the existing Public Bus lines and specially designed Express Bus Lines (X1 and X2), based on free access.
- During the Ceremonies the Baku Metro will be operational by extended hours work regime. The “Elmlar Akademiasy” and “28 May” metro stations will be available for Entry and the others just for Exit.
- No direct transport service will be offered from the Crystal Hall to the airport on the night of the Closing Ceremony.

Traffic Management and VAPPs

- Implementation of the Special Road Lanes (Games Lanes) along Games Route Network (GRN) in the most traffic-congested road sections with support of the State Traffic Police (Police Escort) in order to guarantee an efficient travel time within 10min – 45 min.
- Traffic Control Zone and VAPP system will be delivered at each Venue
- Informational and Directional Signage will be delivered at each venue and along Games Route Network

Complementary sport tickets

All participating athletes and team officials holding “A” type accreditations (Aa, Ao, Ac) will be able to request four (4) complimentary tickets for each-same sport session per day, subject to availability.

Athletes of other sports will be encouraged to attend events, in which they do not compete, as spectators. For the different sport sessions, there will be a limitation of four (4) complimentary tickets per day for any session held that day. Athletes may collect their complimentary tickets at the dedicated ticket box office at the Athlete Village, at the city ticket outlets or venue box offices by display of the accreditation, subject to availability.

Athletes Village

AVL Zones - Access Control Points

The Residential Zone, the Village Square, and the Operational Zone will be separated by internal fencing and access control points.

The AVL can be entered through two access points. One of them, available for residents, is located in the north-east area of the AVL and is connected to the Transport Mall. The second access point is in the north-west area of the AVL, through which the Guest Pass Centre, Media Centre, the EOC Family Office and the Village Square can be accessed.

All individuals and personal items will be inspected at all access points into the AVL. Valid accreditation is required for entry. Individuals with invalid or no accreditation will be denied access to the AVL.

AVL Accommodation

Athletes and team officials will be accommodated in 6 permanent buildings.

Apartments will range from 3-5 double-, triple- or quad- occupancy bedrooms, with bathrooms and social space included.

No Wi-Fi will be available in the accommodation apartments.

Athletes Village Zones

AVL consists of three zones: the Residential Zone, the Village Square and the Operational Zone.

The Residential Zone is a special area with reduced access, intended only for residents with the “R” sign on their Accreditation Card. The Residential Zone consists of the accommodation units, the NOC administrative and medical spaces, a recreation center, dining facilities, the NOC Services’ Centre, the Sport Information Centre and the Medical Center.

The Village Square serves as the assembly point for all – residents, guests and the media. The square is a hub of activity within the AVL, and the place for residents and their guests to meet. The Village Square is also home to the Guest Pass Centre, the Protocol Lounge, the Athletes Village Media Centre and the Olympic Culture and Education Program (OCEP) pavilion booths.

The Operational Zone comprises the Village back-of-house services and the Transport Mall.

Resident Centers

Two 24-hour Resident Centers will operate in the AVL. The Centers provide customer service and logistical support to the residents.

Food and Beverage in the AVL

Athletes and team officials will have access to the Village dining halls. Where will be served menus that are nutritious, healthy, and provide necessary dietary components rich in protein and fiber. The Dining Halls with the capacity of 1200 seats offer a broad range of national and cultural food options offered as follows:

- Breakfast (05:00 – 11:00)
- Lunch (11:00 – 17:00)
- Dinner (17:00 – 23:00)
- Overnight (23:00 – 05:00)

The Dining Halls are located on Level 1 of Building 11 and Building 13. Accreditation should be on display at all times and available upon request at the entrance. This is to ensure individuals are entitled to eat within dining halls.

Athletes and team officials will be encouraged to clear their tables to central waste stations.

Due to the size and capacity of the dining halls, athletes are not allowed to take their bags and luggage inside, bag drop-off points are located at the entrance to the dining halls.

For health and food safety reasons, users of the Dining Halls may only remove one drink, one piece of fruit and handheld food currently being consumed. Exceptions will only be made for sick athletes, by producing a certificate from the First Aid Room, signed by a NOC team doctor and countersigned by a doctor, stating that an athlete is unable to eat in the Dining Halls.

Alternative dining options for athletes and team officials

Venue Meals (VMs) for Athletes, Team Officials and International Technical Officials will be considered and delivered to the venues for those of them who will be away from their accommodation for more than 4 hours being located on the competition venue only. Meals must be ordered from the NOC Help Desk in the NOC Services Centre 48 hours in advance. The distribution of Meal Bags will be provided in their dedicated lounges at the competition venues. Still water will be available for athletes in doping control and /or medical treatment areas.

Delivery of water provision throughout village accommodation buildings:

There is a requirement to provide cases of 500ml still bottled water (ambient) to the entrance areas of each of the buildings that Athletes will be accommodated in during their stay in the Village during the opening days of the Athlete Village. Residential areas and the Resident Centre will have central distribution points for bottled water supply. Teams and officials are welcome to use any of these points when in need of water.

Linen and Towel Exchange Services

In extraordinary circumstances, if linens and towels become unusable before the dedicated change day, replacements can be requested on a one item to one item basis by submitting an emergency request at one of the Resident Centers.

Replacement of Residential Keys

Key Replacement Forms should be submitted to the Resident Centers. The Resident Centers' team will inform the relevant EYOF 'Baku 2019' staff and arrange provision of the requested service.

Key Loss / Replacement

If residents misplace their keys or if they cannot enter their accommodation due to a malfunctioning lock, they should report it to the Resident Centre. An authorization from the respective Chef de Mission or Deputy Chef de Mission will be required to replace each key at a cost of \$20.

Packed Ice for Medical Use

Packed ice will be available at the Resident Centre of Building 11. Although the amount of ice that can be taken is not limited, the delegates are expected to be mindful of the other teams' needs.

Information Desk

The Resident Centers' team will provide information on facilities and services in the Village and other general information, upon request.

Lost and Found

All items found in the Residential Zone will be taken to the adjacent Resident Centre. To keep track of all lost and found items, all incidents are documented by respective staff members of the Resident Centre, with details of the items summarized in descriptive notes attached to the lost and found reports. NOCs wishing to reclaim lost items can visit any Resident Centre to locate their items.

Laundry

Serviced laundry facility will be available at the AVL free of charge for all residents, anytime between 7:00 to 23:00, from 20-28 July. Each resident will be provided with two laundry bags, one for colored clothing and one for whites. These will be placed on the residents' beds prior to their arrival.

Laundry Services and Pick-up/Drop-off Timings

Serviced laundry facility will be available at AVL free of charge for all residents, anytime between 7:00 and 23:00, from the 20th to the 28th of July. Two laundry bags, one for coloured clothing and one for white, will be placed on each resident's bed prior to arrival.

Residents will be assisted at the laundry facility and must collect their laundry after it has been washed. Uncollected laundry bags will be kept in the laundry room for up to 24 hours. After 24 hours, the resident's NOC will be contacted to ensure the soonest possible removal of the laundered linen and clothes.

Housekeeping

At the AVL, housekeeping staff will provide round-the-clock cleaning services in the communal areas of all buildings and in the NOC areas.

Daily service will be provided to ensure beds are made, bathrooms are cleaned, consumables are replenished, trash bins are removed and replaced, rooms are vacuumed and mopped, and the furniture is dusted. The staff will perform maintenance checks.

Bed linens, including one pillow case and two sets of bed sheets will be changed once in the middle of the EYOF, and two fresh towels will be brought in every two days.

Housekeeping runs a 24-hour Help Desk and is available to provide immediate response to emergencies or serious incidents that may occur in residential areas (e.g. large spills or clutter).

Residents are provided with a "Do Not Disturb" sign to manage their housekeeping requests. The sign should be placed on the outside of the door, if they choose not to be disturbed. The room will not be serviced that day. However, residents cannot choose a preferred cleaning time for their bedroom.

Housekeeping staff will not be able to make up the beds or change the bed linen, if personal belongings are left on the bed.

Housekeeping staff have the right to refuse to provide service to any residential room if residents are consistently disrespectful of their living space, demonstrate a disrespectful attitude towards the housekeeping staff or if medical waste, syringes or other bio-hazardous materials are inappropriately exposed, causing a health risk.

Recreation Centre

The Recreation Centre will offer free services to athletes, team officials and the EOC Family members with access to the Residential Zone of the AVL.

The Recreation Centre will be located on the first floor of the building 11. It will be open 24 hours, although some gaming facilities may only operate from 07:00 to 23:00. Centre will offer free wireless internet, a computer gaming area, pool tables, table football (foosball), tennis tables and air hockey.

A number of laptops will be available for residents' use at all Recreation Centers.

The Non-Smoking Policy

The AVL is a non-smoking venue. Smoking, including smoking e-cigarettes and other smoking simulators, is strictly prohibited at any time within any buildings of the Residential Zone of the AVL. A limited number of outside smoking areas will be available outside of the Residential Zone. These areas are marked for clarity. NOCs will be charged a significant fee if the EYOF 'Baku 2019' Operations' Committee is faced with the need to clean out, fumigate, or redecorate residences at the AVL, due to smoking inside.

Alcohol-Free Policy

To support safe and alcohol-free environment at EYOF 'Baku 2019,' rules and guidelines prohibit alcoholic beverage use at all premises throughout the entire territory of the AVL. No alcohol will be sold at the Athletes Village. Additionally, athletes and officials are strongly advised against bringing in their own alcohol to the site.

Residents and guests may not possess, store, dispense, sell or consume alcohol at the Athletes Village.

Athletes Village Medical Center

Medical Center will be operational one day before the Opening Ceremony to the day after the Closing Ceremony. Medical Center will offer primary care services, specialist consultations, and limited sports medicine during normal operational hours, from 07:00 till 23:00 daily.

Emergency medical response via an ambulance service on site will be provided on a 24 hour basis.

Emergency Services

The Village Security Command Centre has separate command and control desks for emergency situations. When assistance is needed, the emergency desks should be contacted immediately.

The emergency services may also conduct functionality checks during the Games' period to ensure that the emergency equipment, systems, materials and the crew are both compliant and fit for the purpose, should the need arise. NOCs will not be considerably affected by these checks; however, they may be contacted if access to their residences is required.
