Important information regarding COVID-19 pandemic

Safety of athletes is of utmost importance, and therefore the following applies:

- 1) The event will only be held, if 2 weeks before the event, the *14-day cumulative number of infections per 100.000 inhabitants* in the organising country is below 20. **If the 14-day cumulative number of infections per 100.000 inhabitants in the region, where the event will take place, is below 20 and for the whole country below 30, EJU can exceptionally allow to let the event to be held** (Reference: European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control <https://www.ecdc.europa.eu/en/covid-19/situation-updates>). If this criterion is not met, the event will be cancelled by EJU.
- 2) No IJF Cadets WRL points will be granted

2. Regulations to minimize COVID-19 related risks

EJU Regulation

EJU has approved Medical regulations for Judo events with the main goal to minimize the risk of getting infected by SARS-COV2. These regulations fully apply and must be observed by all persons taking part in the event (athletes, coaches, referees, officials, etc.). The regulations are constantly reviewed and updated and can be found on EJU website: <https://www.eju.net/documents>

Please, note:

- **All participants (= all members of the participating delegations: athletes, coaches, physios, etc) must present at the registration a medical certificate confirming a negative molecular-biological SARS-CoV-2 test. The certificate must be issued by a licensed medical practitioner in English and THE TEST must not be older than 72 hours at the time of registration.**
- **All participants, whether they are competitors or staff, international or local, must wear a mask at all times. Exceptions: athletes on tatami during contest, where it is prohibited and athletes in the warm-up, where it is the choice of athletes;**
- **All participants must keep 1.5 m distance at all times, except for competitors during their contests and during warming up with ONE PARTNER.**

Additional Regulations by Czech Health Authorities

The limit of 500 people in the sports hall at the same time applies, thus the access to the event will be strictly controlled.

Due to the safety reasons no payments in cash will be possible. All payments from the participants should be made by bank transfer in time specified in the outlines. Organiser will fully refund the payments in case the tournament is cancelled either by the EJU or the Czech authorities.

The participants will have to wear masks in the venue, buses and during the weigh-in.

Before attending the event all participants have to check the travel restrictions from their countries to Czech Republic. Any costs related to possible COVID testing and quarantine shall be borne by participating teams.

WHO Recommendations

In general, all persons taking part in the event are urged to follow the general recommendations set by WHO:

- Regularly and thoroughly clean your hands
- Maintain at least 1 meter distance between yourself and others
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth
- Make sure you cover your mouth and nose with your bent elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze. Then dispose of the used tissue immediately and wash your hands.

- Stay home and self-isolate even with minor symptoms such as cough, headache, mild fever, until you recover

Violating any of the aforementioned rules will be subject to disciplinary action!

This Cadet European Judo Cup is open for all EJU/IJF Member Federations. **There is no limit** in the number of participation for each weight category for every federation. The competitors must be of the same nationality as the National Federation, which enters them.

Please note:

- Above mentioned late entry fee has to be paid in cash on spot.
- Persons without IJF ID Card can only be entered on spot, if IJF ID Card will be ordered until end of Accreditation.
- Persons, who are banned by their Federation cannot be entered as late entry or replacement.

11. Accreditation & Control of Nationality

At least one team official and maximum two must attend the accreditation on **Friday from 10:00 to 17:00** in order to confirm the delegation. Without this confirmation in time, a nation/club will not be put into the draw and will not be allowed to compete.

Passports or photocopies of passports from all competitors must be available on request (national ID Card showing nationality, picture and date of birth or a copy is also accepted). An EJU accreditation card with a photograph will be issued to competitors and officials.

12. Competition Mode

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the latest IJF SOR and IJF Refereeing Rules.

Competition systems according to number of participants:

- 6 and more entries: Double repechage
- 3,4,5 entries: Round robin
- 2 entries: better of 2 fights, if 1-1 the third match will decide.

13. Draw

The draw will take place on **Friday at 20:00hrs.**

The top eight (8) from the entered competitors in each weight category will be seeded according to the current IJF Cadets World Ranking List.

14. Weigh-in

The official weigh in of athletes will be scheduled the day before the competition at 19:00 (see program).

Athletes are not allowed to weigh-in naked. Boys must wear at least underwear and girls at least underwear and a T-shirt. Additional 100g will be allowed for their weight category limits.

Athletes must present accreditation card and his/her passport (National ID Card showing nationality, picture and date of birth are also accepted).

Random weigh-in will not be organised during the Covid-19 period.

15. Refereeing

During the Covid-19 pandemic period the following regulation should be followed: the maximum number of referees inscribed will be limited to 2 per National Federation and 7 per mat. The registration in Judobase will be controlled by EJU and can be stopped at any time if the maximum limit has been reached. The organizing federation may enter as many referees as required for the realization of the tournament, but giving priority to their own Continental/International referees first and then their national referees with the highest national license with at least 2 years of experience. However, if enough Continental/International referees are inscribed in Judobase, the organizing federation has to limit its number of national referees to 1 per mat.

The Referee Meeting will be held **on Friday evening** (see program). The attendance to the Referee meeting is strictly compulsory. The referees should be dressed formally for this meeting.

JUDOBASE registration deadline for referees: Friday, September 04th 2020

The bow:

- The contestants must not shake hands BEFORE the start of the contest.
- When the athletes are leaving the mat they must wear judogi in proper way and are not allowed to take out any part of the judogi or the belt before leaving the field of play.

Special Refereeing Rules for Cadets:

- Application of kansetsu-waza is allowed and should continue until Maitta, tapping twice or the contestant is incapacitated by the effect of kansetsu-waza.
- Application of shime waza is allowed. An athlete who has lost consciousness due to shime waza is not allowed to continue the competition.

16. Coaching

All coaches must fully adhere to the Code of Conduct for Judo Coaches.

Dress Code

Draw:

Jacket suit and tie

Elimination rounds:

National track suit with trousers reaching down to shoes
or jacket suit with tie

Final block:

Jacket suit with tie

17. Transport

Airport: **Prague International Airport**

Train Station: **Teplice Railway Station**

The organizer will provide transfers between the airport/train station and official hotels, between the official hotels and competition venue, draw, accreditation and official weigh-in places. Transportation will be offered only to those participants who are accommodated via the organiser. The transfers are only offered on the days when the delegations are booked in an official hotel through the organisers.

Transfers from Prague Int. Airport Teplice will be charged 20,00 Euro per person one way.

Cancellations

Important: Injuries, visa problems or sickness are not valid reasons for cancellation of rooms.

In case of any damage to hotel property or competition venue caused by members of a delegation, their national federation will be charged by the organizing committee.

In case of tournament cancellation by the EJU or the Czech authorities full payment will be refunded.

All bank fees and money transfer costs must be paid by the sender federation.

The person attending accreditation must bring proof of the bank transfer.

20. Judogi Control

Approved Judogi

All Judoka must compete in IJF Approved Judogi (only red label allowed) and Judogis from all IJF suppliers are allowed (see www.ijf.org → Official Supplier List).

Judogi Control

It will be operated with a Sokuteiki prior to the fight. Judogi must have an IJF Official Label "APPROVED JUDO GI" with an optical code which cannot be falsified. The label will be controlled with an optical lamp. Each of the competition clothing articles (jacket, trousers and belt) must have an IJF official label.

Backnumber

Each competitor taking part in the EJU events is obliged to have sewn on the back of his Judogi the official backnumber (both EJU and IJF are allowed) bearing his surname and his National Olympic

Committee abbreviation. The backnumber can be ordered from www.mybacknumber.com or www.officialbacknumber.com (Attention: production and delivery may take around 4 weeks). The SPONSOR part (if needed) will be given to the head of delegation during registration, and the athletes can stick it themselves using the special glue on the back number.

Markings and Advertising

The space on the **shoulder stripes** (25cm x 5 cm on both right and left side) and on the **upper arms** (10cm x 10cm on both right and left side) can be either used for own sponsors of the Federation or Judoka or EJU Suppliers, **BUT not for any other Judogi supplier.**

The space on the **right chest** (5cm x 10cm) can be used by the Judoka for his/her own sponsor. The logo of a Judogi brand can only be used, if it corresponds with the brand of the Judogi itself and if it is an EJU Supplier. Further, no logo of a competing brand of the advertising reserved for the Federation can be used (unless approval granted by the Federation).

Please note: On all advertising spaces it is strictly prohibited to promote tobacco, alcohol, any substances listed in the doping code, or any product or service contrary to public morals.

The space on the **left chest** (10cm x 10cm) can be used for the national colours or the national emblem corresponding with the IOC code on the backnumber (regional emblems are not allowed).

All other markings on the Judogi, like Judogi brand logos, name of Judoka, etc. have to comply with the IJF Judogi Rules.

Important:

- If an athlete does not respect the Judogi rules, the athlete will not be permitted to pass the Judogi Control, and the coach who is responsible for the athlete will be suspended for the rest of the competition day.
- The organiser is not obliged to provide reserve Judogi at Judogi Control, but the athlete is allowed to present himself in another IJF Approved Judogi, complying with the Sokuteiki rule (and without backnumber) - in this case no coach can go with this athlete to the mat!
- In the case of a repeated offence the coach will be suspended for the rest of the competition.

21. Responsibility of Federations

The competitors will compete under the full responsibility of their federations. Insurance: Each national federation is responsible for insuring its competitors against "injury and third part risk (public liability)" during the period of the event. The European Judo Union and the organiser decline all responsibility.

Consent for Photography/Videos/Filming

Delegates inscribed by their National Federations for EJU events consent to the EJU and its media partners to use content of them, including data, live results, photographs and/or video recordings (hereafter referred to as Media). This media may be obtained from National Federations and EJU. It will also be acquired by the EJU and its media partners from in and around all EJU event venues. Media could be used in print and digital media formats including print publications, websites, e-marketing, posters banners, advertising, film, broadcast, social media, education purposes and other purposes. The National Federation must ensure that they have the permission of each delegate or in the case of a minor the permission of the parent/guardian. If a delegate does not give consent, then the National Federation must inform the European Judo Union by writing to headoffice@eju.net.

22. Anti-Doping

Anti-doping tests might be executed according to the IJF MEDICAL AND ANTI-DOPING HANDBOOK (IJF SOR – Appendix E).
